Science

In year 3 this term for science our topic has been 'How does your garden grow?' The children have had a wonderful time learning about the different parts of a plant and the different functions of these parts. We have explored the life cycle of a flowering plant and considered the best conditions for plants to grow in.

The children have had great discussions throughout this topic and developed their scientific vocabulary.

In year two this term for science, our topic has been Plants. The children have had a great time answering the question, 'what do plants need to stay alive and healthy?' It would be a wonderful opportunity for them to discuss with you their learning and maybe even plant a seed at home to grow and look after themselves. They are experts at labelling the parts of a flowering plant. Well done Year 2!

Year 4. In science we have been studying electricity. Children looked at which items around the house ran from mains electricity or ones which were battery powered. Children completed a lot of practical experiments. They made simple circuits and could describe how to correct circuits if they were not

working properly. Children also tried to make their own burglar alarms and lawnmower circuits.
