Tips for learning the spellings:

- Look, cover, write, check.
- If you are finding a word difficult to learn, highlight the tricky part of the word.
- Say the word aloud as you write it.
- As you say the word aloud, try to over pronounce it to remember the letter order.
- Try breaking the word down into smaller words e.g. beau/ti/ful
- Make tricky words into an acrostic e.g. Big Elephants Can't Always Use Small Exits (because).
